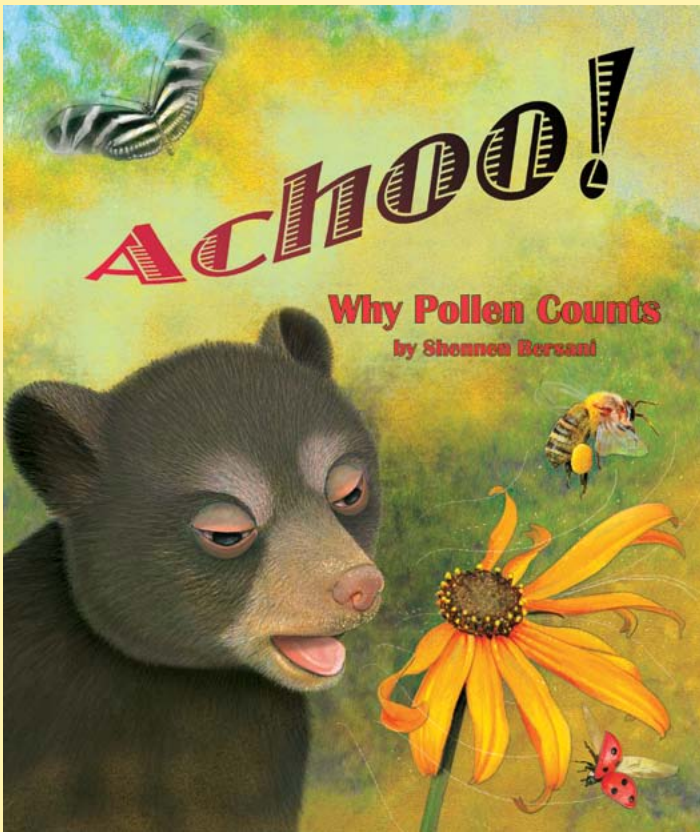


ABOUT THE BOOK

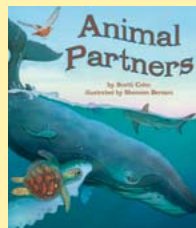

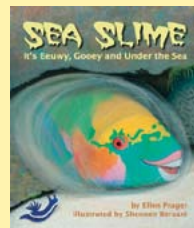
