This team is dedicated to saving animals that live in zoos, aquariums, and sanctuaries in the event of natural disasters, like floods and hurricanes. As of this writing, ZDR3 manages and coordinates a growing emergency response network of more than 170 facilities in 36 states and U.S. territories, including Guam. When a zoological facility asks for help, ZDR3 organizes experienced responders before, during, and after natural disasters. The staff of ZDR3 are dedicated personnel who work year-round to monitor hazards, maintain and grow their response network, and support network readiness. Since it began, ZDR3 has responded to more than 20 zoological organizations to help overwhelmed staff, impacting the well-being of thousands of exotic animals and enabling these facilities to reopen their doors as soon as they are safely ready.
