Shaping Up the Family Debut author draws from her teaching experience in new book

Mt. Pleasant, SC (February 1, 2014) – Kristin Haas understands the struggle that young children face when learning math. In her debut picture book with illustrator Shennen Bersani, *The Shape Family Babies*, they tackle the tough subject of geometry together.

After Mother Rhombus and Father Rectangle welcome three new babies, readers will meet members of the shape family as they weigh in on naming the new additions to the family. Two of the babies are easy to name, but the third shape baby requires careful thinking. Kristin was inspired by both her experience as a teacher and her experience as a child to write this book. "I enjoy putting on voices for characters to make a story more lively," said Haas. "My book was influenced by this. I wanted to include many different characters from different generations to give the reader and listeners the opportunity to play with different voices." The whimsical illustrations by Bersani help readers to clearly identify each shape without losing that element of fun.

Geometry is sometimes a complicated subject for young children; *The Shape Family Babies* includes a For Creative Minds section where children and parents have facts and activities to dive deeper into shape names. Online the publisher offers teaching activities, quizzes and standards alignment to seamlessly integrate the book into an elementary classroom.

Kristin Haas is a third grade teacher with a Masters in Elementary Education. As a teacher, she sees how books inspire learning and engage the minds of young readers. Kristin hopes this book will encourage young math fans at home and in classrooms to learn about the myriad kinds of geometric shapes. This is her debut picture book.
